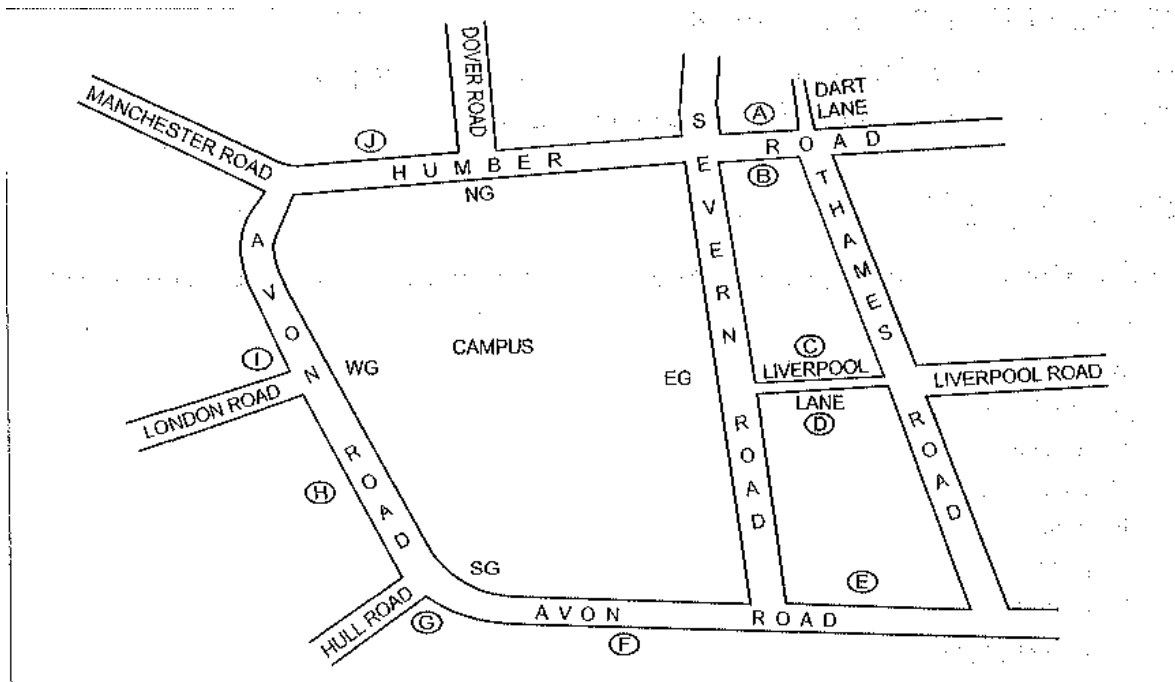

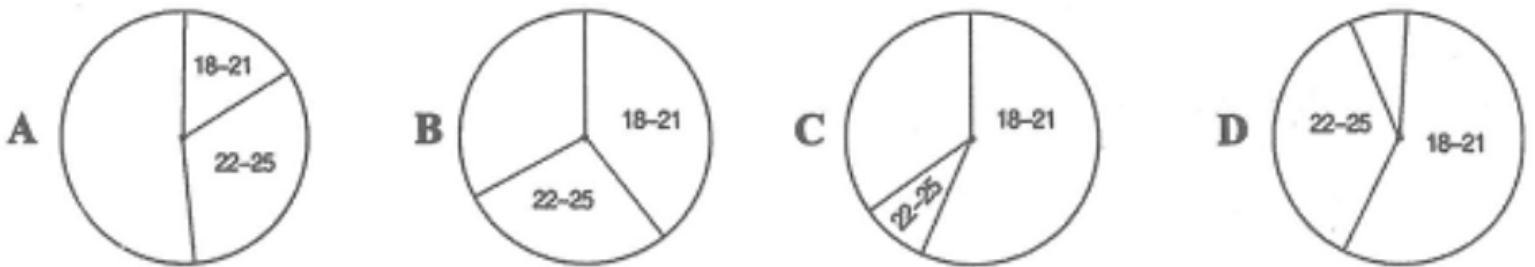

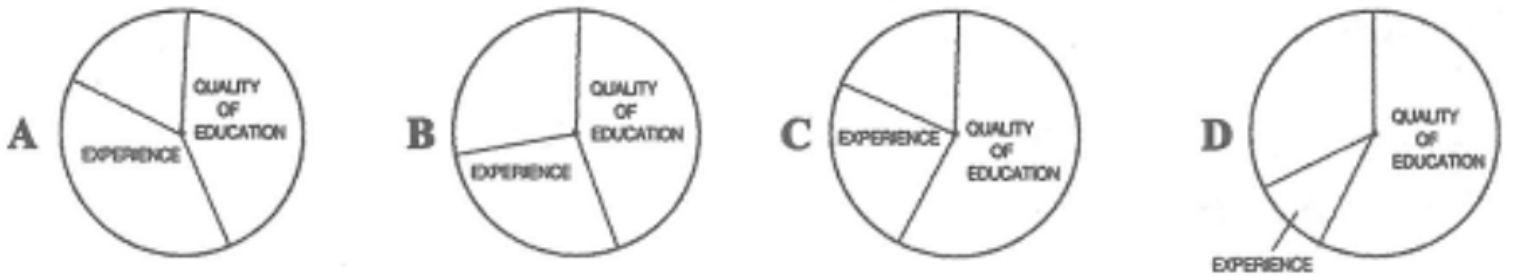
Which pie chart shows the ages of the Asian students surveyed?
